

International Building Code Council (IBCC) Scope and Objectives Statement

SCOPE:

The International Building Code Council (“IBCC”) represents the interests of the built environment and the International Code Council (“ICC”) by providing leadership and direction on matters to meet government, industry and public needs.

OBJECTIVES: Specific objectives of the IBCC are to:

1. Build, improve and coordinate relationships with all interested parties.
 - 1.1 Encourage all interested and affected parties to participate in the ICC Code Development Process.
 - 1.2 Establish dialogue with groups identified by the IBCC that have an interest in the process or the products of ICC.
2. Serve as an appeals hearing-body for appeals of the ICC Code Development Process related to all ICC Codes that are assigned to the Code Development Committees under the IBCC.
3. Seek committee appointments for all representatives to ICC committees the IBCC is responsible to appoint.
4. Make recommendations to the ICC Board of Directors for creating ad-hoc committees for the codes assigned to the IBCC.
5. Where appropriate IBCC members make recommendations to serve as liaison to ICC committees, ICC councils and organizations internal and external to the ICC.
6. Provide opportunities to enhance the understanding, acceptance and use of the building and residential codes by users, regulators and the general public.
7. Provide direction on matters related to the code development process.
8. Coordination of IBCC activities and issues in common with the other Code Councils for the purpose of creating consistency.
9. Prepare and submit a budget and work plan to carry out the IBCC objectives.
