

ICC Scholarship Program

ICC General Scholarship Fund

Purpose: The International Code Council General Scholarships were established to honor those who have been essential to the formation of the ICC or its legacy organizations and have promoted building safety and the public's awareness of building and fire safety professionals. The scholarships are intended to provide financial assistance to children of ICC Governmental Members.

Program Administration

- The International Code Council manages the scholarship account.
- A committee of volunteers will select the recipient of the scholarships.

The selection process is as follows:

- The eligibility of the applicants will be verified.
- The applications will be reviewed to determine if all required information has been furnished.
- The committee will review all eligible applications using the Scholarship Selection Criteria.
- The recipients will be selected by a committee of volunteers and notified by the International Code Council.
- The administrative process and guidelines are as follows:
 - Two scholarships of \$2,500 each will be awarded.
 - Applications shall be received by June 26 of the academic year and submitted to the International Code Council.

- The recipients will be announced in the month of August.
- The maximum number of years that funds may be granted a student is four years.

- Awards are distributed in accordance with current IRS regulations.
- The recipient must be enrolled in a recognized and/or accredited school such as a university, trade school, business college or other as approved by the International Code Council prior to distribution of the award.

Eligibility

Code Enforcement Employees

Applicants shall be children (as defined below) of code enforcement agency personnel. The jurisdictional authority must be an active Governmental Member of the International Code Council.

Children of Code Enforcement Employees

Children must be dependents as defined by the Internal Revenue Service. Typically, this includes birth children, stepchildren, legally adopted children, or a legal ward financially supported by the employee.

Geographic Restrictions

None

Selection Criteria

- The applicant must:
 - Be pursuing educational opportunities beyond the high school level at a recognized and/or accredited institution.
 - Demonstrate a need for financial assistance. Financial information will be required along with detail of any other financial assistance the applicant is receiving.
 - Provide evidence of satisfactory scholastic achievement including grades, test scores and teacher recommendations.
 - Complete the Scholarship Application. A one-page narrative on why the applicant should be awarded the scholarship is also required.
