

Guidelines for Preparing the ICC Global Award

Section I

Name of Recipient

Section II – Basis of the Award

Any or all of the following types of service shall be considered as the basis for nominating an individual or group for the ICC Global Award: Please include write-up for those that apply.

1. Exemplary performance by an individual or group that best promotes and advances the global mission of the ICC and building safety.
2. Significant building code contributions in authoring an ICC technical publication of global relevance.
3. Marked leadership in administrative or special activities that penetrates a new jurisdiction outside U.S.A. borders.
4. Outstanding contributions in the areas of research or testing, leading to new publications or opening up new global markets.
5. Outstanding service or activity that has greatly enhanced the global standing of ICC from within the organization's membership and structure.
6. Demonstrated accomplishments with both the private and public sectors outside USA borders to advance the ICC mission, vision, and promote public safety in the built environment.

Section III – Submission of Nomination

1. To be eligible, a nominee may or may not be a member of ICC in the year the nomination is submitted. An individual or group is only eligible to be awarded the ICC Global Award one time.
2. Current Global Membership Governing Committee members are not eligible to receive this award.

Section IV – Biographical Data (Brief)

Submit a brief biography on the professional background of the nominee or group. Remember, the award is given for distinguished service to ICC global advancements, not the nominee's or group's background.

Section V – Citation

This section should contain one carefully prepared sentence that illustrates why the recipient is receiving the award.

Section VI – Nominating Task Group

List the names, organizational affiliations, and addresses of the persons submitting the nomination. At least three individuals must be listed.
