Remember, as Brent Snyder was fond of saying, "Life is good!"



## PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

#### **MONDAY**

#### AM Increasing the Credibility of the Code Official

Session 601

This seminar is intended to familiarize participants with the skills needed to increase credibility. stated in Section 104.11. The second portion of the seminar will examine sustainable, alternative construction methods such as earth ship, straw bale, cob, cordwood, etc. Attendees will apply the requirements of Section 104.11 to each of these techniques to determine if the intent of the code is met. The instructor will also discuss "easy" qualification of alternatives by using ICC Evaluation Service® acceptance criteria and Evaluation Reports.

## 2012 IBC Inspection of Fire-Resistance-Rated Walls, Floors, Ceilings and Roofs Session 622

Topics covered include identifying the five types of walls and their differences, understanding the differences between floor, floor/ceiling and roof/ceiling assemblies, as well as the protection requirements for penetrations, joint systems, duct and air transfer openings, and door and window openings. Additional discussion will look at test standards used to evaluate the assembly and protections systems and how those protections are limited, or could be compromised if not installed as tested.






