Changes to ICC Exam Appeals Process Start This Month

As of January 1, 2014, the candidate exam appeals process has been significantly changed, to allow Certification and Testing to focus resources on those candidates who have a justifiable concern.

The current policy can be found in the <u>National Certification Exam Information Bulletin</u>. It allows a threestep process at no charge to be initiated within 90 days of failing an exam.

Starting January 1, a mandatory \$100.00 fee is required when filing a formal challenge of a failed exam and this initial challenge must take place within 30 days of receipt of your exam results.
