2025 was a year of transition, momentum and renewed focus for the International Code Council. Led by a new CEO with strong direction from the Board of Directors, ICC reinforced its commitment to members, staff and our mission of building safety. We released our 2030 Strategic Plan, developed through extensive input from members, partners, leadership and staff, that focuses on empowering our members, protecting communities and strengthening our organization for the future.

Throughout the year, ICC deepened our support for members. We expanded education, training and credentialing programs, strengthened chapter leadership, mentorship and workforce development initiatives, and launched new tools and resources to help members access important information when they need it most.

We released the State of the Building Safety Industry Report, an exclusive member benefit compiled from almost 5,000 member and stakeholder responses. The report provides a snapshot of the industry as it stands today and the trends that are moving it forward, including new insights on compensation, career satisfaction, challenges and future opportunities.

More than 23,000 ICC certifications were issued, the global community of Master Code Professionals surpassed 1,000, PRONTO testing expanded and the online member community exceeded 10,000 users.

New chapters were welcomed, scholarships were expanded, and career pathways were strengthened to support the next generation of building safety professionals.

ICC continued to lead the development of building codes and standards to bolster resilience globally. Thanks to the dedicated building safety professionals who volunteered their time on committees, councils and at our code hearings, we advanced more than a dozen standards that support off-site and modular construction, plumbing, accessibility and more.

We also strengthened support for natural disaster mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery through a newly formed Fire & Disaster Mitigation team that directly engages with fire service and emergency management professionals.

We continued to support and advance building safety solutions globally by introducing new programs and collaborating with industry stakeholders.

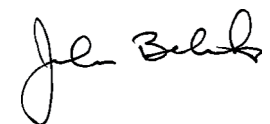

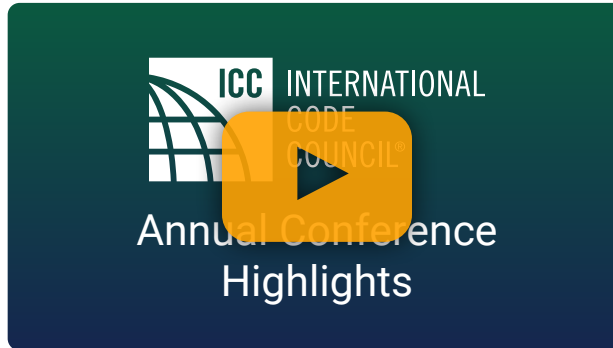
Customer Engagement

Special Events

- Continued to build momentum at ICC Leadership Week + Hearings with over 800 professionals in attendance.

- Building Safety Month's 45th annual campaign received 434 proclamations, including 30 governmental proclamations, and over 500 million earned media impressions.

Membership

- Formed a Fire & Disaster Mitigation team to support members and their communities with building and fire codes, emergency management, disaster mitigation, wildfire preparedness and public safety leadership.
- Continued growth in the [online member community](#), surpassing 10,000 users across 22 countries, and over 70 mentors participating in the refreshed mentorship program.
- Launched new initiatives in the online member community, including administering Membership Council Governing Committee elections, “Ask Me Anything” and the “Take Five Friday” series.
- Expanded ICC’s [scholarship program](#) to support the education of ICC members and their families.
- Welcomed five new Chapters, bringing the worldwide total to 415.
- Released the [State of the Building Safety Industry Report](#) to help members set goals and continue to steer their careers—and the building safety industry—in a positive direction.

Legislative Highlights

- Gathered and transmitted [Pro Codes Act](#) support letters from 78 ICC chapters and eight regions and generated over 200 messages to members of Congress to co-sponsor/support the bill since the Act's introduction in late June. ICC has also built and is leading a coalition of 23 national organizations to seek the bill's advancement.
- [Presented representatives from the Cayman Islands](#) with the nation's first custom building code, based on the 2021 International Building Code®.
- New York City [passed legislation](#) to adopt an Existing Building Code based on the International Existing Building Code® which will become effective in 2028.
- [New York, Nashville and Phoenix](#) adopted the 2024 International Codes®.
- Celebrated California's and Colorado's adoption of the 2024 International Wildland Urban Interface Code® (IWUIC®) and Colorado's adoption of the ICC/MBI off-site construction standards and G6 guideline for closed panels.
- Defended adoption cycles in Hawai'i, Iowa and Louisiana, and successfully protected California's adoption cycle.

Professional Development

- Implemented a customized [exam](#) to support the City of Los Angeles self-certification program to accelerate recovery from the recent wildfires.
- Added a multi-day disaster planning course to ICC’s When Disaster Strikes Institute program.
- Launched ICC’s new [Code Enforcement Program](#) that includes two new code enforcement examinations, with a third coming in 2026.
- Debuted a new [ICC Learn Live subscription](#) for weekly online training opportunities each Wednesday throughout the year.
- Alabama approved as the first provider of the new plumbing continuing professional (CPE) training program.
- Improved online exam delivery with average wait time for a proctor falling to just one minute and overall proctor satisfaction rising to 93 percent.
- Reinstated the annual open enrollment training schedule to strengthen service readiness and enhance member experience.

Codification & Community Development

- General Code and American Legal Publishing finished 2025 with a combined total of over 6,300 customers using the eCode360/ALP platforms.
- American Legal Publishing developed a new Louisiana municipal code – the first in 28 years.
- American Legal Publishing was awarded the 2025 Corporate Step-up Award by the International Institute of Municipal Clerks.
- General Code signed a new professional alliance partner, Clarion Associates, a nationally recognized leader in land use and planning.
- General Code had a record-breaking year in contract sales, with 99 new clients, including the City of Philadelphia.
- ICC Community Development was recognized with the prestigious [Digital Transformation Award](#) at the 2025 Laserfiche® Winners Circle event.
- ICC Community Development launched Muncity Next Gen, a modern, new streamlined platform and completed 26 Laserfiche Cloud implementations.

Consulting Services

- Completed the tornado provisions project for the U.S. Army and continued work on projects for U.S. Naval Facilities Engineering Systems Command (NAVFAC).
- Continued consulting projects for Precast/Prestressed Concrete Institute (PCI).
- Completed Finite Element Analysis (FEA) projects to support manufacturers demonstrating code compliance.
- Offered three all-day in-person seminars and 60 structural engineering webinars.
- Completed five customized specialty codes for the Sultanate of Oman based on the 2021 I-Codes to compliment the Oman Building Code that had previously been completed.
- Provided building code support services for the Republic of the Marshall Islands (RMI) including a workshop for government officials, a week-long plan review institute, digitization of the RMI National Building Code and a three-year ICC Governmental membership.

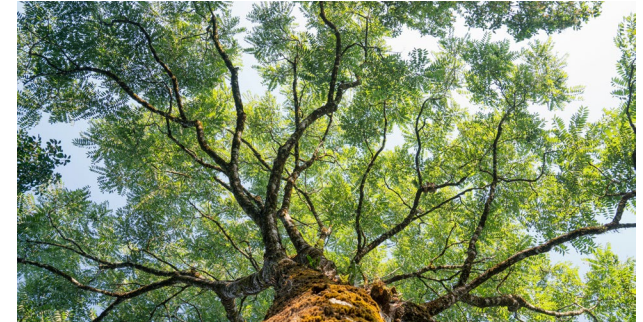
Codes and Standards

In 2025, the ICC Technical Services Group continued to advance our core mission of developing and maintaining building codes and standards that protect public safety and support innovation. We advanced multiple standards initiatives, supported consensus-based code development, and deepened collaboration with industry partners and stakeholders to address emerging challenges and best practices. These efforts reflect our ongoing commitment to leadership, education and global impact on building safety.



Technical Services

- Over 1,000 proposals processed for the Group B Code Development Cycle supporting the development of the 2027 codes.
- Two successful Committee Action Hearings occurred in April 2025 (CAH #1) and October 2025 (CAH #2).
- To address the housing affordability crisis, ICC launched a [study](#) to explore ways to simplify the 2030 International Residential Code®, focusing on maintaining safety while identifying opportunities to simplify and reduce the cost of construction.
- Implemented process improvements to standards and appeals procedures and implemented an online portal to better administer the appeals process.
- Announced plan to restructure the International Energy Conservation Code® (IECC®) starting in 2030 by developing an IECC expanded energy code (IECCX); issued draft scope and intent statements for both the 2030 IECC and IECCX for public comment.
- Released the 2025 Public Comment Draft for the 2027 IECC.
- Released Initial draft of the reimagined ICC Performance Code® (ICCPC®) in August 2025 for public comment.
- Announced new [Standard ICC/BSR/PCI 155-202x: Specification for Test Method of Precast Concrete Insulated Wall Panel Wythe Connectors](#)
- Created the Air Supported Structures Consensus Committee (IS-ASSC).

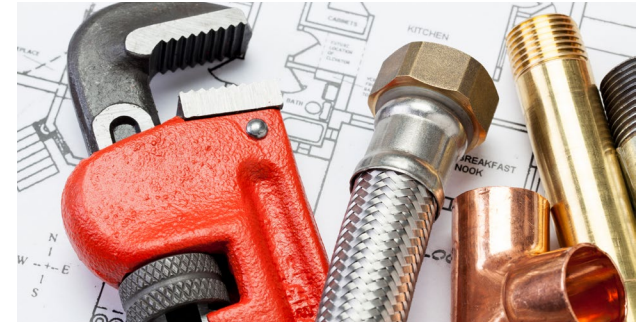


Plumbing, Mechanical & Fuel Gas (PMG)

- [Signed an agreement](#) with the United Association (UA) that underscores ICC’s commitment to plumbers and pipe fitters.
- Established relationships with over 13 United Association (UA) local halls, which resulted in the Local UA 5 in Washington, D.C. and Local UA 43 in Chattanooga joining existing PMG ICC Chapters.
- Collaborated with UA in a “Four Corners” event at ICC’s Annual Conference in Cleveland where close to 30 local UA halls from around the U.S. participated.
- Worked with ICC-ES and Global Solutions to develop a multinational PMG certification framework for manufacturer clients.
- Revised and published over 30 PMG training modules to include the 2024 I-Codes.

Energy & Innovation

- Announced collaboration with the Center for Offsite Construction (CfOC) to develop critical standards for modular construction through the creation of the [CFOC/ICC 1220 Standard on Configurations and Connections for Off-Site Construction](#).
- [Joined global stakeholders](#) participating in the UN Global Climate Change Conference (COP30) in Belém, Brazil to elevate the importance of having strong, right-sized building codes supported by a robust ecosystem for compliance to ensure both resilience and sustainability in the built environment.
- Developed a [roadmap](#) to bridge the gaps in codes related to the use, manufacturing, storage, testing, and recycling of batteries and energy storage systems.
- Partnered with Pew, the National League of Cities and the American Planning Association to [host roundtable discussions](#) on permitting and zoning best practices that support housing affordability. We subsequently [published an overview of solutions](#) posed during the discussions, which links to results of an ICC member survey on these topics conducted in Q3 of 2025.





Conformity Assessment

The Conformity Assessment Group continued to ensure building safety and affordability through testing, certification and inspection of new and innovative products. ICC-ES enhanced support for communities and customers through targeted technical assistance, global service coordination, expanded code recognition, digital modernization, new service offerings, and increased testing capacity. ICC NTA supported regulatory transitions, expanded its compliance services footprint, and strengthened its position in key housing and construction markets. The International Accreditation Service continued to help organizations demonstrate compliance and competence to their customers, regulators and the public.

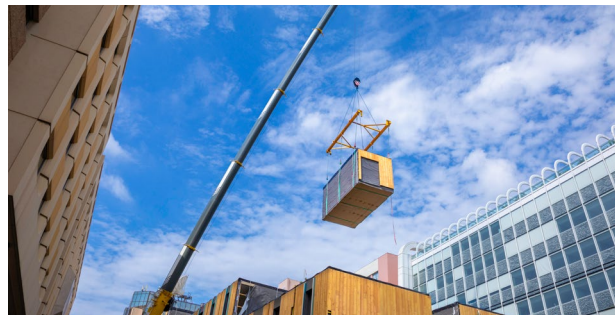




- Launched [specialized support efforts](#) in response to the Los Angeles wildfires aimed at assisting local rebuild efforts.
- Introduced a [Global Concierge Program](#) to better serve manufacturers seeking global market access as a seamless, single point of contact solution for navigating complex international certification requirements.
- Expanded the ICC-ES Evaluation Report (ESR) program to include Canadian National Building, Fire, Plumbing and Energy Codes.
- Introduced a new [Electrical Services](#) division, offering pre-certification services, factory audits, and technical training.
- Announced a [strategic collaboration](#) with Sustainable Minds to increase environmental product transparency in high performance building projects.
- Began construction on a new, larger building and plumbing testing services facility in Elkhart, Indiana, with an estimated completion date of July 2026.



- Processed over 10,000 manufactured housing plan submittals in preparation for the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) code updates that took effect on September 15, 2025.
- Drove strategic growth by scaling modular compliance services and onboarding a leading modular building manufacturer, strengthening market position.
- Signed a contract for ongoing work with a Clayton Home Building plant in Middlebury, Indiana, to strengthen market share in the HUD market.
- Introduced an enhanced version of the [online fee estimator](#) for plan review services, enabling greater accuracy and faster quotes.



- Marked its 50-year anniversary in September 2025.
- Hosted customer events in Al Seef, Bahrain, and Kuwait City, Kuwait, both attended by local customers and featured remarks from U.S. Embassy representatives in each location.
- Hosted a World Accreditation Day webinar that featured speakers from QAI, Wimpey Laboratories and the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) Institute of Quality.
- Coordinated customer and assessor meet-ups while attending the APAC meetings in Bengaluru, India.
- Joined Global Accreditation Cooperation Inc. (Global ACI), the international organization for accreditation bodies that is replacing ILAC and IAF in October.
