Top News

- The U.S. Department of Energy announced plans to allocate \$90 million in grants to aid
 the implementation of stronger building energy codes for new and renovated structures.
 The International Code Council will lead a project to develop a digitization roadmap to
 support small and under-resourced jurisdictions in their transition to electronic code
 enforcement processes. Click here to learn more.
- The U.S. Department of Energy's National Labs published a new report "Enhancing Resilience in Buildings Through Energy Efficiency: Standardized Methodology and Resulting Analysis Demonstrating the Value of Codes and Above Code Measures to Hazard Resilience," outlining the value of the 2021 IECC in enhancing resilience in response to more frequent and intense extreme weather events attributed to climate change.

Standards Development

- Development of ICC/MBI Standard 1210-Mechanical, Electrical and Plumbing Systems and Energy and Water Conservation in Off-Site Construction is in the process of responding to comments received through its first public review draft.
