I. WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS

Call to Order. Medard Kopczynski, Chair called the meeting to order.

ICC Code of Ethics: CP #7 Section 5.1.10 Representation of Interests,

Enstrom, ICC presented for reference.

Roll call of committee members. Keith Enstrom, ICC called the roll of committee members in attendance. There was quorum of committee members in attendance. The attendance roster is included below.

Review and approval of the previous meeting minutes. The previous meeting minutes were approved without correction.

Review and approval of the agenda. The meeting agenda was approved without correction.

II. TASK GROUPS PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION

A. Administrative Requirements: Shamim Rashid-Sumar, Chair Steve Winistorfer, Vice-Chair

Steve Winistorfer provided an update of the task group progress. The group meets every 3 weeks on Mondays at 1pm Eastern time. The next meeting is on May 1st.

Keith Enstrom, ICC displayed for discussion the latest draft of the Section 101.1 Scope that included comments from Jason Smart of AWC.

Steve Winistorfer provided the following meeting summary notes:

Most of the discussion revolved around whether the scope should be limited to structures on a specific site, as it currently is, or extended to include community-wide or development-wide needs and requirements.

There were two sides of discussion:

The general sentiment (from Anne, Med, and Gary Ehrlich primarily) was that ICC 605 needs to be limited initially so the current draft is not far from what the final version will be. Ehrlich used the example when designing for wind, where wind loads and characteristics outside of the specific site are taken into account (loads, direction, terrain, etc.), the results of which are then used to design structures on any specific site. Ehrlich also argued that having ICC 605 get into development or community requirements might conflict with zoning codes, something it should not do.

David Torgerson argued that there needs to be a broader scope definition that DOES take into account WUI factors beyond a specific site. Torgerson said that he thought that this is why there is a Task Group for Site and Area Requirements. He also offered that the fourth paragraph of the draft of Section 101.1 where "the lot they are contained within" is used should include the word "area."

B. Site and Area Requirements: Anne Cope, Chair Marco Mack, Vice-Chair

Anne Cope provided an update of the task group progress. The group meets every 3 weeks on Tuesdays at 2pm Eastern time. The next meeting is on May 2nd.

C. Building Design Requirements: Chris Brunette, Chair Kathy Clay, Vice-Chair

Chris Brunette provided an update of the task group progress. The group meets every 2 weeks on Fridays at 11am Mountain time. The next meeting is on May 5th.
