On behalf of the Home Builders Association of Greater Austin, we write to express strong support for transitioning the development of the International Energy Conservation Code (IECC) from the current governmental consensus process to an American National Standards Institute (ANSI) committee-based process. The suggestion for this change originated from the ICC Board of Appeals after it heard and considered the many issues that were raised in the appeals filed on the 2019 ICC Group B results. In addition, the ICC Board Committee on Long Term Code Development Process also determined that ICC should consider changing the development of the IECC committee-based standards process.

There are several reasons this change is needed:

- It will improve the timing and ICC code development process for all of the codes by streamlining the process, while maintaining their rigor and validity.
- The energy code is getting more complex, with each iteration of the IECC requiring more discussion and modifications of the proposed changes. An ANSI committee approach will allow for more deliberative discussions, resulting in a more balanced and costeffective code.
- The Group B process showed that the online vote allows for political manipulation of the outcome. Changing to an ANSI process will eliminate this possibility and better ensure the results are representative of the broader ICC membership.
- The committee responsible for developing the code via the ANSI process can be more responsive to conceptual changes to the codes as well as resolve potential conflicts between related changes.
