GUIDELINES FOR INTERESTED PARTIES TO PROVIDE FEEDBACK TO THE CODE COUNCIL BOARD OF DIRECTORS REGARDING THE IECC

On December 16, 2020, the International Code Council Board of Directors put forward a framework for the updating of the International Energy Conservation Code (IECC) and Ch. 11 of the International Residential Code (IRC) using the ICC standards process, subject to stakeholder input and final approval by the ICC Board. On January 21, 2021, the ICC Board will conduct a virtual teleconference meeting, during which it will hear from these interested parties and stakeholders (hereinafter “participants”), in accordance with the following procedures:

- A registration process will be required for participants looking to provide a presentation to the ICC Board during the meeting. This registration link can be accessed from the [IECC webpage](#). Participants must register by **Monday, January 11, 2021**.
- Approximately two (2) hours shall be allotted for hearing from all participants.
- The length of time for each speaker will be determined by the volume of commenters. Additional details will be shared with the registered participants after the January 11 deadline.
- No redundant testimony will be permitted.
- No visual presentations will be permitted.
- No rebuttals will be permitted.
- ICC Board members may ask questions after each participant has completed their presentation.
- The ICC Board will go into executive (confidential) session to deliberate, and its final decision shall be announced on a later date.
- The President of the ICC Board has the discretion to make amendments to these procedures as he deems reasonably appropriate.
- For interested parties looking to listen to the January 21, 2021, Board meeting without providing a presentation, an audio-only YouTube livestream will require its own separate registration via the [IECC webpage](#).
