The Portland Cement Association and Simpson Strong-Tie join ANCR to create the first whole-community resilience benchmarks in the U.S.

The application deadline for volunteer committee openings and for lead company sponsorships is extended to February 16

Washington, D.C. – The Portland Cement Association (PCA) and Simpson Strong-Tie have joined the International Code Council and the Alliance for National & Community Resilience (ANCR) to create the first whole-community resilience benchmarks in the U.S. This self-assessment system will provide communities a transparent, practical and commonsense way to quickly and easily gauge their cross-sector resilience efforts.

PCA, a nonprofit organization serving America's cement manufacturers, generously donated \$25,000 to ANCR. In addition, Simpson Strong-Tie, a world leader in structural product solutions in the U.S., pledged \$10,000 to support the development of the buildings benchmark, one of the core functional areas for all communities.
