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Federal Funding Streams for 2024

Department of Energy (DOE)

- Resilient Efficient Code Implementation (RECI) Program
- Assistance for Latest and Zero Building Energy Code Adoption (IRA)

Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)

- Post Disaster Code Administration & Enforcement Assistance (DRRA 1206)
- Building Resilient Infrastructure in Communities (BRIC) Codes Plus Up
- Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP)

Housing and Urban Development

- Community Development Block Grants (CDBG) (state formula and entitlement programs)
- CDBG Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR)

ICC Grant Success to Date



- We have supported at least 50 jurisdictions with grant applications in 2023.



- Trained 150 members on our new Federal Grant Basics for Code Officials training course.



- Our Grant Newsletter reaches 1,500 people on average per month.



- Have dedicated at least 10 hours per month to 1:1 technical assistance with members from states, tribes, and territories



- ICC is a recipient of a FY 23 RECI grant award and a partner on 8 other projects supporting states across the country on energy and building code projects.

Big Picture

Resilient and Efficient Code Implementation (RECI) Program

\$225 million -- \$90 Million for 2024

competitive grants for “**sustained cost-effective implementation of updated energy codes**” ([Sec. 40511](#) of the IIJA)

Seeking State and other Jurisdictional Partners for 2 RECI projects

- The University of Miami Project assesses the impact of the International Green Construction Code (IgCC) on diverse U.S. climate regions, aiming to achieve zero-carbon electricity by 2035 and net-zero emissions by 2050.
- ICC plans to develop a web-based software tool that streamlines energy code provisions for builders and designers, reducing confusion and enhancing compliance. This tool, initially focused on the 2024 IECC Residential Provisions, will generate custom project documents and compliance checklists based on specific project details, benefiting both project teams and code enforcement authorities.

Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) Assistance for Latest and Zero Building Energy Code Adoption

\$1 billion in assistance for latest and zero building energy code adoption (FY 22-29) (Sec. 50131 of the IRA)

\$330M supporting adoption of the latest model energy codes

- 2021 IECC for residential and ASHRAE 90.1-2019 for commercial (or equivalent)

\$670M supporting adoption of zero energy codes

- Zero energy provisions of the 2021 IECC (or equivalent stretch code)

Must implement a plan to achieve *full compliance*

- including active training and enforcement programs
- and measure of the rate of compliance each year



Building Code Plus-Up Overview

- \$112M State/Territory Building Code Plus-Up (\$2M per state or territory)
- \$25M Tribal Building Code Plus-Up
- In addition to FY23 State/Territory Allocation (\$112M) and Tribal Set-Aside (\$50M)
- Purpose is to incentivize building code adoption and enforcement activities such as:



Evaluate adoption and/or implementation of codes that reduce risk.



Enhance existing adopted codes to incorporate more current requirements or higher standards.



Develop professional workforce capabilities through technical assistance and training.



FEMA

Federal Emergency Management Agency

Eligible Costs

- Overtime for budgeted employees
- Straight and overtime for unbudgeted employees & extra hires
- Costs associated with temporary hires or contract support is eligible
- Other costs associated with extra hires or contracted support may be eligible for reimbursement.
- Purchase of supplies and equipment to execute work is eligible
- Legal cost related to enforcing building code or floodplain ordinance
