
Henry L. Green, Hon. AIA



The National Institute of Building Sciences appointed Henry L. Green as President and CEO in August 2008, retiring in 2019 after over 10 years' service in 2019. Prior to this appointment, Henry served as Executive Director of the Bureau of Construction Codes in the Michigan Department of Labor for more than 19 years.

Henry has extensive experience on professional boards including: as a founding member of the International Code Council Board of Directors, completing a term as President in 2006; the National Institute of Building Sciences Board of Directors, serving as Chairman in 2002 and 2003; and the Building Officials and Code Administrators International (BOCA) Board of Directors, holding the position of President in 1997.

Henry was named "1990 Man of the Year" by the Automatic Fire Alarm Association (AFFA), and received the "Distinguished Service to Government" award from the Building Industry Association of Southeastern Michigan in 1998. He received the "Walker S. Lee Award", BOCA International in 1999. In 2005, Henry was recognized by the United States House of Representatives for his work as "...a tireless advocate for building safety and enforcement of codes." and was named an Honorary Architect by the American Institute of Architects in 2008. In 2010, the High-Performance Congressional Caucus Coalition honored Henry for is leadership toward widespread realization of high-performance buildings. He received the "Bobby J. Fowler Award" from the International Code Council in 2013. American Society of Civil Engineers awarded Henry with the "ILC Member Appreciation Award" for dedicated and continuous support of the ASCE Industry Leaders Council. BOMA International awarded Henry the "Distinguished Service Award" for his work for the improvement of existing building and the overall built environment. In 2019, the National Institute of Building Sciences awarded Henry the "Mortimer M. Marshal Lifetime Achievement Award".
