OF THE CITY OF CITRUS HEIGHTS

PROCLAIMING MAY 2026 AS

“BUILDING SAFETY MONTH”

WHEREAS, the City of Citrus Heights is committed to recognizing that our growth and strength depends on the safety and essential role our homes, buildings and infrastructure play, both in everyday life and when disasters strike; and

WHEREAS, “Built to Last” the theme for Building Safety Month 2026, highlights the importance of modern building codes, safety professionals, and resilient construction practices to ensure safe homes and communities; and

WHEREAS, our confidence in the safety and resilience of the buildings in our community is made possible by the dedication of building safety and fire prevention officials, architects, engineers, builders, tradespeople, and others in the construction industry who work year-round to ensure safe construction; and

WHEREAS, these guardians are dedicated members of the International Code Council, a nonprofit that brings together local, state, territorial, tribal and federal officials who are experts in the built environment to create and implement the highest-quality codes and standards to protect us in the buildings where we live, learn, work and play; and
